Thank you for your generosity last month for Breast Cancer "Go Pink" Campaign. We were able to send \$200.00 to the American Cancer Society.


Thankful

Curriculum Coordinator's Column

Sharing, Caring, Giving, and Thankfulness

These are words heard so often in the month of November. We begin to teach children at a young age to use manners - to say words like "Please" and "Thank You." We model sharing and taking turns. And we help them use kind words. As educators and parents we hope that these gestures and actions stick with them throughout their entire life.

To encourage your child to want to share, always praise your child when they share. Point out others sharing, talk about how it makes a person feel when they share and when someone shares with them.

This month the children will have the opportunity to share with others in the community. When the 3's and 4's go to chapel, they can bring canned vegetables, canned soup, or canned fruits to be placed in a collection basket near the door. If you forget, or if your child does not go to chapel, there will be a collection "tub" near Chef Dana's Kitchen bulletin board in the long hallway all month long. The food will go to the Food Pantry at St. Patrick's Center in Wilmington.

But giving does not always have to be about material things. Helping others is also giving—simple chores at home (set the table, carry groceries in from the car). Compliment them "I like your smile," or even share a smile—which has a positive effect on the giver and the receiver!




